

SECRETARY REPORT:

- Dale Westby moved to approve the minutes of August 17, 2021 as read. Steve Harker seconded. Motion passed.
- Secretary Parker reported that she sent out 16 second notices for membership dues on Thursday, August 19, 2021.
- We currently have nine members who have not yet paid their dues and four members who have dropped.

TREASURER REPORT:

- Main income in August was from paid lunches, donation from Pundmann Ford's Mustang Club event, and the Festival of the Little Hills Fundraiser.
- Main expense in August was reimbursement to Mary Krogmeier for Back to School Donations project.
- As of August 31, 2021, the general checking account had a balance of \$10,435.26. The savings account had a balance of \$5,572.11. The CD's total \$30,484.34. General Accounts total was \$47,674.65. The Scholarship Fund balance was \$182,771.95. The dues account showed a balance of \$1,182.94.
- Dale Westby moved to file the August financial report with the auditor. Gerry Prinster seconded. Motion passed.
