

OPTIMIST CLUB OF ST. CHARLES BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES September 15, 2020

CALL TO ORDER: President Steve Harker called the meeting to order at 1:28 pm.

ATTENDANCE: Bob Beckman, Dave Borgmeyer, Roger Deppe, Mike Ebert, Steve Harker, Mary Krogmeier, Fred McGinley, Ellen Parker, Gerry Prinster, Jack Ross, and Dale Westby.

SECRETARY REPORT:

- Jack Ross moved to approve the minutes of August 18, 2020. Fred McGinley seconded. The minutes were approved.
- Ellen Parker reported that since we have sent out invoices for the 2020-21 Optimist year, we have had 37 members paid, 6 members dropped, and 5 members still unpaid. Final notices to those 5 members will be sent out this week.
- Ellen Parker presented a list of items that need to be discussed at the October board meeting, the first meeting of the new year and asked members to be thinking about suggestions for this year's pig fund. The items that will be included on next month's agenda include:
 - Establish committees and appoint chairpersons
 - Review by-laws
 - Establish annual dues
 - Set amount for benevolent gifts (currently (\$60)
 - · Decide on recipient for annual pig fund
 - Approve Budget

TREASURER REPORT: Treasurer Dave Borgmeyer reported that:

- Finances are in better shape due to income from the golf tournament, but expenses for the event are not yet paid.
- Dale Westby stated that we do not need to return Baue's \$550 payment for dinners and advertising for the Spaghetti Dinner, even though that fundraiser had to be cancelled. We greatly appreciate the donation.
- As of August 31, 2020, the general checking account had a balance of \$3,426.81. The savings account had a balance of \$5,070.08. The CDs total \$37,149.41. General Accounts total was \$47,765.65. The Scholarship Fund balance was \$183,527.22. The dues account showed a balance of \$2,119.35.
- Roger Deppe moved to file the financial report with the auditor. Gerry Prinster seconded.
 Motion passed.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

President Harker reported that 21 people have RSVP'd for the end of the year banquet. He
asked one last time to submit pictures for his video. He also stated that seating would be
socially distanced.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

• <u>Golf Tournament</u>: To be held Monday, September 21. Chairman Fred McGinley reported that 15 foursomes have signed up and that he would be meeting with the people from the golf course to finalize details.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

• Community Council—"Community Partners": Roger Deppe reported that we are already members of the Community Council at a cost of \$250 per year. To get our logo on the newsletter will cost an addition \$1,000. He stated that he was passing along the information but that he was not recommending we pay the extra money for publicity. No action taken.

NEW BUSINESS:

- New Member: Gerry Prinster moved that we approve Elena Cook as a new member. Mary Krogmeier seconded. Motion passed.
- Presidential Plaque: Ellen Parker moved that Roger Deppe have the engraving updated on the presidential plaque at a cost of \$25. Bob Beckman seconded. Motion passed.
- Social Media: Bob Beckman suggested that since our Social Media person, Alison Griffith, would no longer be with the club, that we combine some of our media outlets (Facebook, newsletter, and website) to the same chairperson. It was agreed that all outlets were important. No further discussion or action taken.
- Feedback on OI Questions about Membership Retention: Ellen Parker presented the questions asked by the EMO District Membership Chair and asked for input. She will then submit the feedback to the chairperson.
 - Q: What is the main cause for our members to leave within their first 5 years?
 - A: Health issues; too many "irons in the fire"; membership was paid for by a community sponsor and that sponsor was no longer able to make the payment; unable to attend meetings during work day
 - Q: What can you do at the local club level to correct this issue?
 - A: Reach out to members who are losing interest; get new members involved in committees right away; be more conscientious and make initiation a more important occasion.
 - Q: How can we at the district level help you?
 - A: Cheaper OI dues; allow "community representatives" to join free of charge or at a reduced rate; send a welcome acknowledgement from EMO to new members.
- Special thank you to outgoing board members Roger Deppe and Carl Sandstedt for their service to the club over the past two years.
- Special thank you to Steve Harker for his outstanding leadership and service as President, especially through the tough times we have had this year.

CORRESPONDENCE:

- Thank you note from St. Charles West High School for our donation to their Traditions graduation event.
